2025 UNITED CUP – TALKING POINTS

- The **ATP Tour** and **Hologic WTA Tour** are launching the tennis season with the **United Cup** team event for the third consecutive year with Team USA winning the inaugural edition in 2023 by defeating Team Italy and Team Germany lifting the title last year after defeating Team Poland in the crucial mixed doubles tie.
- Combined 8 Top 10 players will be in action at the 2025 **United Cup** with four Top 10 players from the [PIF WTA Rankings](#) and four Top 10 players from the [PIF ATP Rankings](#) look to begin their season playing for their country. Team USA is the only nation in this year's competition with both No. 1 players inside Top 10.

- Eighteen national teams will compete across six groups of three teams competing in a round-robin format. Each team can have up to six members – a maximum of three ATP players and three WTA players. Perth's RAC Arena and Sydney's Ken Rosewall Arena will host three groups with the competition taking place from December 27 to January 7. Each tie will consist of two singles matches followed by one mixed doubles match.
- WTA No. 3 **Coco Gauff** and ATP No. 4 **Taylor Fritz** headline the competition as the No. 1 seeds. Gauff is making her United Cup debut, while Fritz makes his third appearance (5-2 singles record), highlighted by 2022 title. Playing in Perth, they'll face off against Team Canada and Team Croatia in the Group A.
- Last year's finalists, WTA No. 2 **Iga Swiatek** and ATP World No. 16 **Hubert Hurkacz**, return to United Cup as No. 2 seeds, as they continue to seek first team title for their nation in one of three active national team competitions. Swiatek owns an 8-1 singles record at the event, including 5-0 last year and Hurkacz is 5-4 at the event in singles. They face Team Czechia and Team Norway in RR as they aim to reach the semi-finals for the third consecutive year (2023 SF, 2024 final).
- Captain **Lleyton Hewitt** will lead the home Australian team that includes World No. 9 **Alex de Minaur**. At United Cup last year, de Minaur broke inside the Top 10 for the first time becoming the first Australian since Hewitt in 2006 to reach Top 10 on PIF ATP Rankings, helped by biggest win of career over No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** in United Cup QFs. He is joined by 22-year-old WTA No. 97 **Olivia Gadecki**.
- Australians will be playing in the Group F in Sydney against No. 6 seed Team Great Britain, that includes de Minaur's fiancée WTA No. 24 **Katie Boulter**, and No. 17 seed Team Argentina, led by ATP No. 39 **Tomas Martin Etcheverry**. Australia will face Team Great Britain in group stage for the third consecutive year with Great Britain leading their head-to-head 2-0.
- Defending champions, Germany's ATP No. 2 **Alexander Zverev** and WTA No. 80 **Laura Siegemund** saved 2 MPs in deciding mixed doubles tie against Team Australia in semi-finals, going on to take the title. The No. 11 seeds are playing in Group E in Perth, joined by No. 5 seeds Team China and No. 13 seeds Team Brazil.
- No. 3 seed Team Greece with ATP No. 11 **Stefanos Tsitsipas** and WTA No. 32 **Maria Sakkari** and No. 4 seed Team Italy with WTA No. 4 **Jasmine Paolini** and ATP No. 32 **Flavio Cobolli** round out Top 4 seeds.

2025 UNITED CUP – PERTH SINGLES PLAYER BIOS

UNITED STATES – GROUP A

Taylor Fritz | Age: 27 | World No. 4 (Career-High) | 2024: 53-23 (2 Titles) | Career: 284-190 (7 Titles)
> Former World No. 1 junior achieved career-high No. 4 in November 2024, becoming the first American man since Blake in 2006 to play in Nitto ATP Finals championship match and finish inside Top 5 on year-end rankings.
> At 2024 US Open, became the 1st American man in Grand Slam final since 2009 after earning wins over No. 8 Ruud in 4R, No. 4 Zverev in QF and No. 20 Tiafoe in all-American semi-final.
> Defeated No. 2 Nadal en route 2022 Nitto ATP Finals SF after beating him in 2022 ATP Masters 1000 Indian Wells final to become that event's 1st American men's champion since Agassi in 2001.
> Advanced to 1st Grand Slam 4R at 2022 Australian Open and 1st Grand Slam QF at 2022 Wimbledon after entering season with 0-7 record in Grand Slam 3R matches.
> Reached 1st ATP Tour final at 2016 Memphis as 18-year-old WC, becoming youngest American finalist since start of ATP Tour in 1990.
> Clinched inaugural United Cup for Team USA in 2023, helped Team World capture Laver Cup in 2022 and 2023 and captured bronze medal at 2024 Paris Olympics in men's doubles w/Paul.

Coco Gauff | Age: 20 | WTA World No. 3 | Career-High No. 2 | 2024: 54-17 (3 singles titles) | Career: 208-88 (9 titles)
> Went 3-for-3 in finals in 2024, winning Auckland, Beijing and a historic first WTA Finals Riyadh title. Success in Saudi Arabia saw her win a record \$4.8m in prize money, the most ever awarded in women's professional sports, and defeated the World No.1 and No.2 at the same event.
> Finished 2024 season strong winning 16 of last 19 matches; in addition to titles at Beijing and WTA Finals, also reached R16 at US Open and SF at Wuhan in that stretch
> Posted a new career-high of No.2 in June 2024 after advancing to SF at Roland Garros
> Won debut Grand Slam singles crown in 2023 lifting title on home soil at US Open (d. Sabalenka in F). Picked up another three titles in 2023, marking first WTA 1000 title at Cincinnati and debut WTA 500 title at Washington DC, in addition to WTA 250 Auckland. In doubles was co-ranked No.1 with Pegula after US Open.
> At 18 years old, made Top-10 debut on September 12, 2022, following QF run at US Open (l. Garcia); has remained in the Top 10 every week since

Felix Auger-Aliassime | Age: 24 | World No. 29 | Career-High No. 6 | 2024: 32-25 (Madrid Final) | Career: 215-147 (5 Titles)
> Achieved career-high No. 6 and earned personal-best 60 wins during breakout 2022 season, including career-long 16-match win streak with 3 titles in as many weeks at Florence, Antwerp and Basel.
> Also in 2022, won Rotterdam title to snap 0-8 start to career in singles finals, advanced to 3rd straight Grand Slam QF at Australian Open, and swept team titles at ATP Cup, Laver Cup and Davis Cup.
> Led ATP Tour with 45 hard-court and 31 indoor wins in 2022, highlighted by victories over No. 1 Alcaraz and former No. 1s Djokovic, Murray and Nadal.
> Reached 2024 Madrid final to become the 1st Canadian clay court ATP Masters 1000 finalist in series history.
> At 2021 US Open, became 1st Canadian men's singles semi-finalist in tournament history (since 1881).
> As an 18-year-old in 2019, became youngest Top-25 player since Hewitt, 18, in 1999, youngest ATP 500 finalist in series history at Rio de Janeiro (since 2009), and youngest semi-finalist in Miami tournament history (since 1985).

Leylah Fernandez | Age: 22 | WTA World No. 31 | Career-High No. 13 | 2024: 31-24 (R-Up, Eastbourne) | Career: 129-94 (3 Titles)
> In 20 main draw appearances in 2024, highlights were reaching first final on grass finishing R-Up at Eastbourne (l. Kasatkina) and SF at Hong Kong. Also reached final of Cincinnati in doubles w/ Putintseva
> Finished 2024 season ranked No. 31, her best year-end ranking of her career, her fourth consecutive year finishing in the Top 50
> Most recent singles title came at 2023 Hong Kong (3rd title, d. Siniakova)
> Won first two career singles titles at Monterrey claiming back-to-back titles (2021, 2022)
> In 2023 defeated Paolini at Billie Jean King Cup Finals to lift title with Canada
> At 2024 United Cup went 1-1 with a win over Daniela Seguel (Chile) and losing to Maria Sakkari (Greece)

Borna Coric | Age: 28 | World No. 90 | Career-High No. 12 | 2024: 12-19 (Montpellier Final) | Career: 222-194 (3 Titles)
> Owns 11 wins vs. Top 5 and ended 2018 at career-high No. 12 after finishing 2015 as youngest player in Top 50 and 2014 as youngest player in Top 100.
> As World No. 152, upset No. 3 Nadal en route to 2022 Cincinnati title, becoming lowest-ranked champion in tournament and ATP Masters 1000 series history.
> Defeated Federer to win 2018 Halle title, ending Swiss' last run as World No. 1 and becoming youngest champion in tournament history at age 21.
> Saved 5 MPs vs. Kohlschreiber for 1st ATP Tour title at 2017 Marrakech and 6 MPs vs. Tsitsipas en route to 1st Grand Slam QF at 2020 US Open.
> Helped Croatia capture 2018 Davis Cup, but missed 12 months from March 2021-March 2022 – including Davis Cup Finals – due to right shoulder injury.

Donna Vekic | Age: 28 | WTA World No. 19 | Career-High No. 18 | 2024: 32-20 (R-Up, Bad Homburg; silver medal, Olympics) | Career: 289-246 (4 Titles)
> Finished 2024 season ranked No. 19, equaling her career-best year-end ranking
